NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS MEMORIAL WEEKEND WILL HONOR AND REMEMBER 226 FIREFIGHTERS

Six Pennsylvania Fallen Firefighters Among Those Being Honored on May 4-5, 2024

EMMITSBURG, Md. – The National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF) will host the **43rd National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Weekend** (Memorial Weekend) on May 4-5, 2024 in Emmitsburg, Maryland. This year's national tribute will honor 89 firefighters who died in the line of duty in 2023 and 137 firefighters who died in previous years. The honorees will include the following Pennsylvania firefighters:

Fire Police Officer Shawn Giles, age 53, of the Fuller Hose Company No. 1, was directing traffic on 8/20/23 to assist the Pennsylvania State Police who were investigating a two-vehicle crash when a vehicle drove into the crash scene and struck him. He was transported to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased due to the injuries sustained.

Fire Police Offier Timothy "TJ" Johnson, age 56, of the Pleasant Volunteer Fire Department, responded to an emergency medical call at a residence on 10/16/2023. After returning to the station, he complained that he was not feeling well. Upon returning home, an ambulance was called, and he was transported to the hospital where he died on 10/17/23 due to a heart attack.

Chief Robert Klinefelter, age 82, of the Bauerstown Volunteer Fire Department, died on 12/30/2020 due to complications of COVD-19.

Firefighter/Fire Police Officer Brian Martinez, age 46, of the Mont Alto Volunteer Fire Department, died on 1/1/2022 due to complications of COVID-19.

Firefighter Colin Reedy and his girlfriend, Firefighter Emily Gindele were responding to the fire station for an emergency medical call during a heavy downpour on 10/20/2023. The vehicle left the roadway and struck a tree. Colin Reedy was pronounced dead at the scene. Emily Gindele was transported to the hospital and is recovering from her injuries.

Firefighter Nicholas "Nick" Sava, age 65, of the Oakmont Fire Company, died on 12/14/2020 due to complications of COVID-19.

Detailed information about each of the 226 firefighters being memorialized can be found on the 2024 Roll of Honor.

"National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Weekend is a time for our nation to pause and reflect on the heroic efforts and selfless service of the fallen firefighters we are paying tribute to this year," said NFFF CEO Victor Stagnaro. "We will always remember the bravery, commitment, and sacrifices of each of these 226 heroes—and their families."

There are **two events open to the public** at the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Park on the grounds of the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) during Memorial Weekend.

- The National Fallen Firefighters Candlelight Service is on May 4 at 7:30 pm ET and will be hosted by Fire Captain Garon Mosby of the St. Louis Fire Department.
- The **National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service** is on May 5 at 10:00 am ET and will be hosted by actor Jeremy Holm.

Fire service and government leaders are scheduled to address the thousands of attendees at the Memorial Service on Sunday, May 5. The NFFF will live stream both events on the NFFF's website (firehero.org), YouTube channel, and Facebook page.

There are additional events during Memorial Weekend provided exclusively for the families and fire departments of honored firefighters. These include small group sessions and other activities throughout Friday and Saturday; they are open to the families and coworkers of newly honored and previously honored firefighters.

All can participate in <u>Light the Night for Fallen Firefighters</u> (May 1 – 5) by lighting their homes, businesses, landmarks, or fire departments with red lights. Other ways to remember include <u>Bells Across America</u>, <u>Sound the Sirens</u>, and by signing a virtual <u>Remembrance Banner</u>.

In addition, the American flag will be lowered to half-staff on all Federal buildings on Sunday, May 5. The public is also encouraged to lower their American flags that day to recognize the men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Public Access And Parking

Public parking for Memorial Weekend is at <u>Liberty Mountain Resort</u> (78 Country Club Trail, Fairfield, PA). Shuttles from Liberty Mountain Resort will begin at 3:30 pm on Saturday, May 4 for the Candlelight Service and at 7:30 am on Sunday, May 5 for the Memorial Service.
