National Community Impact Award Honors Exceptional Leadership in Saving Lives Through Living Kidney Donation

Celebrating the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, Knox Company, and Chief Ron Siarnicki for Their Unwavering Commitment to Supporting First Responders

Emmitsburg, MD - February 13, 2025 – Kidneys for Communities' prestigious National Community Impact Award, which honors organizations and individuals demonstrating exceptional leadership, vision, and dedication to saving lives through living kidney donation, was presented Wednesday morning, highlighting remarkable contributions to the cause.
